- 1. Democracy- a system of government by the whole population or all the eligible members of a state, typically through elected representatives
- 2. Constitution- a body of fundamental principles to which a state or other organization is acknowledged to be governed
- 3. Executive Branch- The branch of federal and state government that is broadly responsible for implementing, supporting, and enforcing the laws made by the legislative branch and interpreted by the judicial branch.
- 4. Legislative Branch-the branch of the government that writes, debates, and passes laws.
- 5. Judicial Branch- The judicial branch of the U.S. government makes decisions/interpretations of laws.
- 6. Preamble- a preliminary or preparatory statement; an introduction
- 7. Bill- a draft of a proposed law presented to parliament for discussion
- 8. Law- the system of rules that a particular country or community recognizes as regulating the actions of its members and may enforce by the imposition of penalties
- 9. Citizen- an inhabitant of a particular town or city
- 10. Rights- a moral or legal entitlement to have or obtain something or to act in a certain way
- 11. Responsibility-the state or fact of having a duty to deal with something or of having control over someone
- 12. Governor- the elected executive head of a state of the US
