- **1. Fossil:** the remains or an impression of a prehistoric organism preserved in in rock
- 2. Erosion: the process of wearing away by wind, water, or other natural agents
- **3. Weathering:** to wear away or change the appearance of something by long exposure to the air
- 4. Physical Properties: the appearance, texture, color, and odor of an item
- 5. Landform: a natural feature of the earth's surface
- 6. **Delta:** a low, watery land that forms at the mouth of a river and is typically shaped like a triangle.
- 7. Glacier: a slow moving, long lasting body of ice on land
- 8. Island: a land mass that is surrounded by water on ALL sides
- 9. Isthmus: a thin strip of land that connects two larger land masses
- 10. Mountain: a very tall hill, many of these landforms close together create ranges
- 11. Strait: a narrow body of water that connects two larger bodies of water.
- 12. Valley: the low land between mountains or hills
- 13. Peninsula: a piece of land that is surrounded by water on 3 sides
- 14. **Canyon**: a landform that spans many miles, is a deep valley with steep sides, and is typically carved out over many years by a river
- 15. **Mesa/Plateau**: a large, flat topped landform with steep sides that is higher than the land around it
- 16. **Hill:** a small amount of land that is raised higher than the land around it, typically rounded at the top
- 17. Lake: a body of freshwater that is surrounded on all sides by land
- 18. **River**: a body of water that flows across the land, rapidly or slowly, and can run into a sea or ocean
- 19. **Volcano:** a mountain that has an opening at the top and can erupt lava and gas from inside the Earth
- 20. **Plains:** a large area of land that is flat
- 21. Bay: a body of water that is partially surrounded by land
- 22. Ocean: a large body of salt water that surrounds continents
- 23. **Continents:** any of the world's main continuous masses of land (Africa, Antarctica, Asia, Australia, Europe, North America, South America)
